True Legends of the East Anglia Cartophilic World

I am very sorry to have to inform members of the death's of two club

members, Derek Bradshaw and Derrick (Gus) Garrod.

Derek Bradshaw passed away quietly on Sunday (20th) after a long illness, he was 94 years old. It was Derek who introduced me to EACCC in 1983 and we travelled together to the club for many a year. I was pleased to call Derek my friend, he was a very knowledgable cartophilist. Derek worked for a national insurance company, here in Kings Lynn and I used to love going into his office and talk cards, what he didn't know about cards wasn't really worth knowing. He sold his collection (through the club auction) a few years back and he was always amazed at how much I paid him out each month. Derek was club secretary in 1982/83 and helped provide much stability and wisdom to the club and it's members. Although he has been in a care home for the last couple of years, I still sent him the newsletter every month and I understand Cynthia his wife would read it to him so he could keep informed on how the club was progressing. I have a lot to thank Derek for and I will always appreciate and remember a nice man. His funeral is at Mintlyn Crematorium in Friday 1st September at 1.45pm. I will certainly go and say thanks to Derek from myself and all club members. Derek's picture is number three in the 1993 EACCC Personalities.

Derrick (Gus) Garrod died in Queen Elizabeth hospital Kings Lynn on Friday (25th) after a fall in his home, he was 96. He loved coming to the club every month and will always be remembered for travelling miles in his three wheeled Reliant Robin. He was a member of the Cartopilic Society of Great Britain and also the Boston Card club. He always bought Albert Watson to the clubs and when doctors told him not to drive any more he was always grateful for a lift to the clubs from me and lately Colin Gamble. He was always a good passenger in the car and had many a tale to tell of his younger collecting days, He rarely missed a meeting and was last with us in June. I don't have his funeral details yet but will pass the word when known. Gus is number 11 in the 2007 set of EACCC Personalities.
