It is going to be a busy month in April as we intend to have an Easter Raffle (the April meeting is on Easter Saturday), so bring along prizes please in March and April. Proceeds for club funds. Also subscriptions are due in March and April and I will be around to relieve everyone of a £10 note, the best buy you will ever make. We have to fit in a AGM as well, (not that ever takes long).

Les was ready at 12.30 to make a presentation and when order was achieved, he introduced two representatives from our chosen charity 'Help the Heroes'. The proceeds from our Christmas raffle.

It soon came round to 1.00am and that only means one thing to our members, Auction time. The lots had been perused with appraising eyes, numbers noted down, and an eager audience sitting ready to furiously wave their yellow bidding number. We knew it wasn't going to be a great auction and the final result proved us right. Of the 250 lots, 68 remained unsold many not even receiving a bid. This was because there was a lot of common Players and Wills sets and although the quality was good, the rarity was missing. Most of the membership have all the common sets they want in their collection. We don't want to refuse to take items in for the auction but common cards do not sell and therefore do not help the club or the members. They are a waste of time us trying to sell them. My personal opinion is we need to have a change of attitude to what is acceptable to be included in the auction - take all cards but maybe bundle the more common sets up into 'bulkier' lots of maybe 10 sets. What do you think, why not tell us your views. The facts and figures for February auction are the 360 lots sold for £2887. There were 18 successful in house bidders parting with £1739, a further 10 successful postal bidders who spent £1148. There were 7 vendors and unfortunately 68 remained unsold. We had to wait until the very end for the top spot, Lot 250 a lovely set of Singleton and Cole, Famous Film Stars being knocked down to a postal bidder for £130, a real bargain.

Next month we do it all again - in just 4 weeks time on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> March with a plethora of dealers. Booked in are Peter Beer, Ken Courtney, Ken Sanderson, Mike Heard, John Shaw, John Haddon Silver, Gary Challis, Geoff McMillan, Derek Golson and 'believe it or not Mike Prior. Standing room only in the hall. It hurts me to say this but if anyone wants to drop out it might help after all there is only so much money to go round. I have a waiting list of dealers wanting to come to us and to be realistic 9 is our maximum.
