On a happier note I took Gus to see our good friend Albert in his care home in Shouldham last week. He was on very good form and talked about the club and some members. Unfortunately he can't continue his collecting 'addiction' (and yes thats what it is) in his new home. He sorely misses it and the club.

We had another two members join this month, Paul Dale and his niece Sarah Dale from Ipswich. We hope you enjoy your membership and are able to come most month's. They take our membership number up to over 90 now, a very healthy number.

We have finalised our plans for our December meeting and an approximate timetable is enclosed with this newsletter. Please don't forget to bring your raffle prizes in, they don't need to be anything expensive or extravagant just nice, perhaps with a Christmas theme. This years chosen charity is Bowel Cancer UK. Tickets were on sale at this meeting and I have already banked £135. Please remember the auction of 200 lots starts earlier at **11.00am.** The free Christmas themed buffet will be around 12.45, don't forget to bring your 'docky bags' there is always plenty to go round. The final reminder is for every one to wear a Christmas jumper or shirt, or hat or even just socks – whatever takes your fancy.

Also enclosed with this newsletter is a flyer for next years convention, make a note of the date, it's not to be missed if you are a card collector. I was busy this month selling the new Murrays price guide (or book of dreams as it is known by some people). The club has bought 2 boxes of 26 for club members and after discussion with Les agreed to sell them to members for what we paid for them, £10, the retail price is £12.50. I did sell a lot of them but have about 20 left, please ask me if you want one. It's the book all cigarette and trade card collectors use.

The auction was soon on us and Alan was ready to find new homes for the 250 lots, some of them were very keenly fought after but as usual we had the more common sets that weren't. The final figure was a respectable total of £2897. There were 20 successful postal bidders who spent £1401 but there were also 20 successful in house bidders who spent a further £1496. There were 7 vendors and only 21 remained unsold. Alan had some 'silly bids' this month (you know what I mean, £2 bid for a set listed at £200) which he used his auctioneers prerogative and refused to offer them up, even as a starting bid, that's not fair to the vendors who wouldn't appreciate us selling them at the bids offered. We had to wait until Lot 249 for top of the shop, a really nice set from 1908 Salmon & Gluckstein The Great White City, selling for £300, just short of half catalogue. Next month it is easy to predict the top seller, and you won't have to wait long, Lot 1 – a part set 45/50 James Taddy very rare Black back British Medals and Decorations, almost certain to exceed their lower estimate of £600.

Alan has told me he has completed the listings for January (copy enclosed), February and March and is about to start on April. This will be a special auction of mostly top quality rare cards, so we will be trying to beat our club record – see below --- it will also we hope be included with Card World and circulated to it's 550 members. If you want to include any items for this listing they must be with us by the next meeting. We have about 100 lots already so more room if you have any you wish to include.

If you can't make it I really hope you have a wonderful and peaceful Christmas and that 2023 will bring you everything you wish for in your continued search to inprove your collection.
