We had a short meeting this month, firstly to tie up the final details for the Christmas meeting but also to chat about our hosting next year's CSGB convention in Kings Lynn. Top lot was early 0 Lot 29a lovely set of the very rare Barratt Test Cricketers being knocked down for a ton.
