I have restocked the club cupboard with Albums and Pages and have most colours and sizes in stock now, so just ask if you need any. There are no used albums or pages available at the moment, any that I have sell out first thing in the morning.

I bought a dozen sets in this month from a member who wanted to put them in the auction but couldn't wait six months. I had him price them (what he wanted) then tried to sell them for him. I sold a few and he was pleased and said he might have some more next month. They were priced 1/3rd to 1/2 Murrays catalogue but were all excellent condition. Our members certainly know a bargain.

This month's auction didn't look to be much, with only a few bids from our regular postal bidders but we finished with a creditable total of £2858 for the 300 lots. Only 36 remained unsold and although 38 made only a £1 coin, it turned out to be our 2nd lowest total of the year. There were 27 successful postal bidders who spent £1627 on 79 lots as well as 24 successful in house bidders spending £1237 on 185 lots, these were provided by 8 vendors. Top slot this month was Lot number 40 a lovely set of BAT Wild Animals of the World being knocked down for £150.
